Own Clothes Day, Friday 15th February

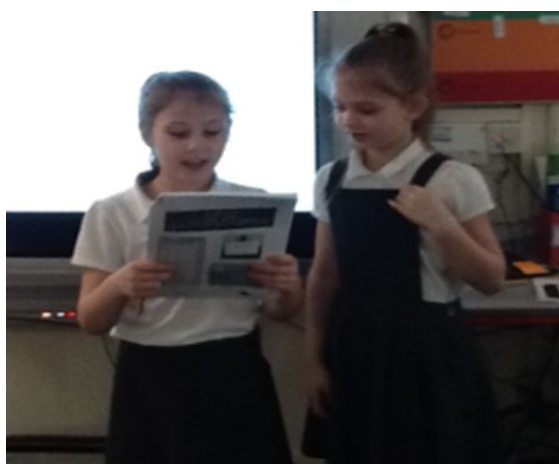
Wear 'red' for Valentines Day on Friday 15th February. Cost is £1 per child.



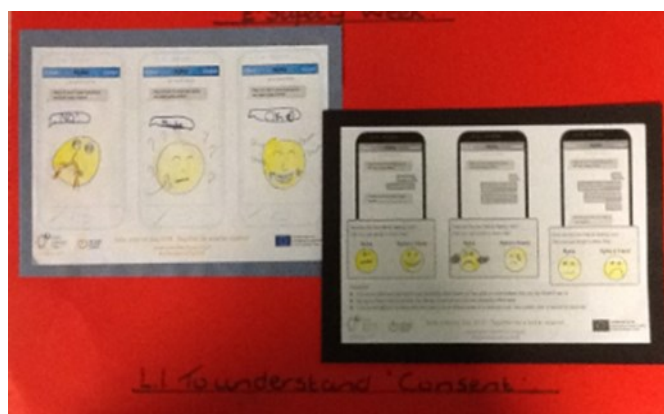
We've had an exciting day this week exploring how to stay safe online, specifically looking at asking permission.

3BM started our online safety day off by performing an assembly for KS1 and KS2. We then had a great time tackling this subject in our classrooms. Some of the things we did are below.

We used drama to find a safe solution in different online situations.



We also thought about kind ways to say no, in circumstances where we didn't feel comfortable.



Key things we learnt were:

Sometimes organisations will ask permission before they do something that might affect you- always ask permission from an adult.

If what you're doing online might affect somebody else, always ask their permission first.

If something makes you worried, uncomfortable or upset its always okay to say no.
