
Miss Goodfellow spoke exceptionally well at the conference, which is held at Birmingham City Football Club, describing how the project began and developed over the last 12 months.

Poster competition

Instructions: Research your poster

Investigate and imagine all the amazing journeys that take place around the world. Here are some topic ideas to get you started:

- What sort of journeys have you made? E.g. holidays.
- Research famous journeys; e.g. Amy Johnson's flight alone from Britain to Australia or Charles Darwin's journey on the HMS Beagle.
- Think about journeys that might be made in the future or travels through time.
- Other than travel, what other journeys can you think of? E.g. life cycles of animals or plants, the water cycle, or the life cycles of materials such as plastics.
- Why not use page 16 as inspiration for a Guinness World Records themed poster? The winner of the Junior category will get the chance to spend a day in the life of the Guinness World Records team at the global headquarters! Use the link opposite to find out more.

Make your poster

Once you've done your research, it's time to get creative! Your poster must be:

- 2D (flat) if you make a model, you need to just send us a photo of it on A4 or A3 paper
- You can use pop up pictures, pull out tabs or use materials such as paint, drawing pencils, crayons and paper.

Send us your poster

Posters will be judged on creativity, how well it fits the theme and how well the poster has been made or drawn. Once the poster is complete, write your children's information on the back, fill in the online registration form, and then post your entry to us at:
