We currently have a large number of dehumidifiers running 24/7 and carpet cleaners booked for the beginning of next week.





Warwickshire Safeguarding have sent us a statement about their Relationship Education Programme, All About Me, which has recently received considerable unwelcome profile. I have decided to reproduce the statement in full due to a number of you asking me about the newspaper article this week.

All About Me is a programme that many schools in Warwickshire use. Your school currently does not use the programme but that may mean that your parents are more concerned as they will not have had the briefing that parents of children at schools using All About Me will have had.

You may wish to use some of the following messages to parents of children at your school to provide them with reassurance. In order to ensure a consistent message, they have also formed the basis of our briefings to councillors and MPs.

It might be of some comfort that, although there has been a lot of negative comment on social media, the views of people in Warwickshire remain very balanced. The more heated criticism seems to be coming from out of county. Nevertheless, we appreciate that parents may be concerned so we have provided the information below to help you to provide reassurance.

The facts:

- 1. The "All About Me" programme is not about sex education. It is about relationships education and staying safe.
- 2. The allegation that six year old children are taught "self stimulation" is inaccurate and simply not true. The picture shown in the Mail on Sunday was a screenshot of professional training materials, developed for the teachers who will be using the programme. This is not the language or material that is used in lessons. Teachers have asked for support, guidance and materials to give them confidence in dealing with specific issues or questions that may arise from children. This material is for teaching the teachers, it is not the material used directly with schoolchildren.
- The programme is an evidence-based resource which has been thoroughly researched and is planned and delivered in line with the national statutory Department for Education guidance
- 4. All About Me has been in place in Warwickshire for over a year and was preceded by a similar programme which ran for six years. It is used by many schools across Warwickshire and feedback is usually very positive

The "All About Me" programme

- 1. This programme is evidence-based and thoroughly researched. It draws on a range of resources including NSPCC materials.
- 2. Relationship education is compulsory. If schools choose to take up the "All About Me" programme, they consult with governors, teachers and parents before signing up to the programme. At this point, they are given full training to deliver the programme along with ongoing support.
- 3. The programme is fundamentally about safeguarding; talking to children about how to stay safe. It draws on, among others, NSPCC materials. It is based on using ageappropriate language and materials and teachers are able to select the material that is appropriate for their pupils' age, understanding and questions. The essence of the programme is about giving children the skills to make safe choices.
