Here, you will find tips, activities and important information which will help you and your child to stay safe online.

- Avoid location tracking—Location aware apps are now tracking data 1. and linking local adverts to where your children are going. Turn them off wherever possible to avoid spam adverts.
- Power up your passwords- Work together with your child to help 2. them come up with safe passwords. Think outside the box (not just a name and number). Always remind your child not to share their passwords.
- 3. Skip quizzes— Help you child to identify clickbait, quizzes, special offers and anything which asks for private information.

PARKING WARNING

I have received a formal letter this week from Runwood Homes who are the parent company for Orchard Blythe. The content of the letter is hugely disappointing as it covers a subject previously addressed on several occasions and represents an escalation in Orchard Blythe's position.



The letter requests that the school inform parents that CCTV is being upgraded at the home to capture anti-social actions from our parents. Despite the installation of a barrier to prevent unauthorised access there have been examples of cars being driven over the grass to continue to park there. Also the letter includes serious alleged acts towards Orchard Blythe Staff from members of our school community.

Runwood Homes would like all parents to be aware that the sole purpose of the CCTV is to capture future incidents so that prosecutions can be instigated. They have stated that they will be taking a zero tolerance attitude to anyone being physically or verbally abusive towards their staff members.

I would again remind those picking up and dropping off that Respect for our neighbours should always be paramount in our actions and decisions.
