

Mrs Fenner has been using the beds as a leaning opportunity with pupils too. Each variety planted has a laminated fact sheet alongside it so that the children can learn names of plants, how best to look after them and what conditions they need to thrive and flourish.

Classes for Next Year


Congratulations

Now that the focus is shifting to schools returning in September we urge you to consider your uniform requirements now to avoid disappointment.

With the effect the COVID-19 virus has had on businesses worldwide, including our own, we are sending out these reminders earlier than usual. We predict a large bottleneck of last minute uniform orders from parents so we recommend you start planning any uniform requirements you may have sooner rather than later.

In the interests of safety we are only offering home deliveries (delivery to school has been suspended). All orders placed will be processed on a 'first come first served' basis in the interest of fairness. Like most other businesses, the COVID/Lockdown situation is having an effect on our lead times. Our current cut-off date for orders to be delivered before the new term (Sep 2020) is 7th Aug 2020. **Note however that this can no longer be guaranteed so we urge you to place your orders a.s.a.p.**
