Parent Survey: Remote Learning

Thank you! We have had a great response to the remote Learning survey with almost a hundred received which has given us an extremely strong representative sample to take guidance from.

For key questions about usage of Live Lessons and Purple Mash there was a consistent positive response of between 85-90% which gives us confidence that we are on the right lines—we just want to make it even better if we can.

There were many really helpful suggestions in the open text questions with a noticeably high percentage of respondents contributing (usually they are the ones people skip over!)

Obviously much is opinion (some feel there is too much work; some feel too little) however there are also themes which can be looked at, for example, lagging chat functions causing issues or 'To dos' closing too early and not allowing access on later days —we can look at how better to elicit pupil responses and extend the 'To do' dates. We will review the answers and collate more of these themes over the next few days.
