PE reminder: Earrings and Jewellery

An extract from our PE Policy.

"Advice from the Association for Physical Education (AfPE) supports our practice within school with all earrings being removed completely; children are not allowed to put tape around them (as may have been the practice in years gone by).

Children who wear earrings will not be able to take part in practical lessons but will be able to take on the role of scorer or evaluator where appropriate.

Please find below details as to why earrings should not be worn; 'The reason not to wear earrings (or any jewellery) is that it can lead to injury for the wearer and for others in the class and it is the teacher's duty of care that must apply here. The reason is both about tearing of the ear lobe, but also the post of the earring going into the neck which is where the brachial nerve is running directly to the brain.'



Teachers are not allowed to remove earrings for children. Whilst we are willing to guide children as to where to store their earrings during the sessions, staff cannot be responsible for any losses. Parents should encourage their children to learn to remove their own earrings or parents remove them for the whole day when PE is being taught.

We also recommend that a good time to get ears pierced is the beginning of the summer holiday so that the ear is sufficiently healed to allow earrings to be removed in September."

SEND NOTICE: Fidget Toys

We have noticed that there has been a mini 'craze' for bringing fidget toys into school in some classes.

These devices are one of the ways we support some children with their concentration in school. We have a range available to us and invest in more regularly. We work closely as a team to determine who would benefit from their use and provide them to children at the discretion of the class teacher and SENDCo.

Children who have not been provided with a fidget toy by the school to support their learning are <u>not permitted</u> to use them in class. Fidget toys **should not be brought into school from home** unless this has been

agreed with the classteacher and SENDco. Teachers will remove items from children and return them at the end of the day to be kept at home.

Please could you support us and not provide children with their own fidget toys, unless already agreed with their current class teacher. We appreciate your support in this.
