### **Y6 to Lead Diocese Celebration**

After a recent visit from the Diocese, our visitor was so impressed with our Year 6 Reflection Areas that they have chosen some of our children to lead part of the 'virtual' Diocese Y6 Leavers Service.

The service, which will be played in more than 50 schools across Birmingham, was pre-recorded last week with Summer and Nicole starring. They showed how Y6 have used their reflection areas to plant

seeds and then care for them as they grow. Caring for their seedlings will be shown as a symbol of committing to care for themselves as they go to secondary school, and look out for others as they go too. As Summer and Nicole deliver their piece, children across the diocese will pause, plant their own seeds and do as Y6 have done in preparation for their transition.

#### End of Year 2020-21

It has been another week of changing guidelines, with Warwickshire Local Authority issuing their latest updated guidance on Wednesday afternoon following the delay to lifting all COVID restrictions on June 21st 2021.

Sadly, this has further impacted on the remainder of the year. Year 6 transition to secondary schools will be <u>virtual only</u> in all Warwickshire schools. Therefore, Year 6 children <u>will not be attending the secondary school on July 7th</u>. The Coleshill School have also notified us that their planned summer schools will no longer be running.

We will now run our own internal transition day on the morning of <u>Friday July 9th</u>. Children will spend the morning with their new class teachers in their new classrooms.

Schools have been asked to retain pupil bubbles, a maximum size of 30, for the remainder of the half term and keep COVID practices, which have become accepted routine, in place. With the highest rate of COVID transmission occurring in the 5-12 year old age group, Public Health Warwickshire are advocating a highly cautious approach during these last weeks to help contain the spread of the virus.

We do want to end the year on a high for our children though and so through July we will be having lots of exciting things happen. Here are some of them...

#### **Sports Days**

Children will be enjoying sports competitions across the day on Tuesday 13th July and Wednesday 14th July. Please send children into school in PE Kit but with a T-shirt of their house colour if possible. We will take plenty of photos to share with parents so you can get a flavour of the day as children compete for the School Sports House Shield.

#### **Proms in the Playground**

On Thursday 15th July our children will be treated to live music outside by the Coleshill Town band. Mr Fagg will be in touch with members of the band who are at school to remind them to bring their instruments on that day!

#### **Leavers Outdoor Presentation** (ticket only)

On Friday 16th July we will be inviting parents to an outdoor presentation by Y6 to mark their graduation to Secondary School. This will be a strictly ticket only event. Tickets available on application (more details to follow). All of Y6 will present first to 6J parents and then 6B parents in 2 separate presentations.

#### **Music Concert**

On Monday 19th July we will be having our end of year music concert which will be streamed into class-rooms. Parents of instrumentalists who would like to see their children perform can request a link to the streamed concert and watch live from their homes or mobile devices.

#### Non-uniform (Break the Uniform Rules) Day

Tuesday 20th July will be a non-uniform day where you are allowed to break the rules for one day only! This is a joint PTA and school council fund raiser with all of the profits split between the PTA and St Peters and St Pauls church.

#### Last day

Wednesday 21st July is our last day of term including traditional signing of the shirts for our Year 6 children. To ensure Kid's Club can continue to operate for our parents, finishing time will be as normal 3:10pm (Rec/KS1) and 3:20 (KS2).

In addition to this, we are working with the PTA to deliver some special moments for our Year 6 leavers before they leave us and head to Secondary School. Watch this space Year 6!!






#### **Online Safety**
