A Wonderful Roman Day in Year 4

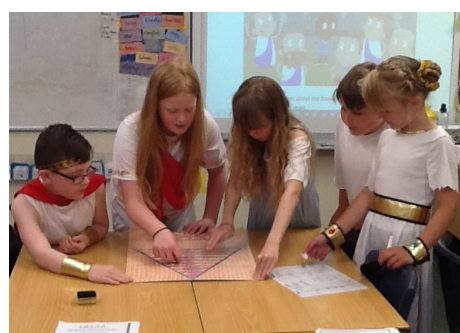


It is so exciting to begin to have our curriculum enriched with visitors and educational trips again (read on to see Year 2's amazing week).

COVID-19 UPDATE

We have had several cases of Coronavirus confirmed this week. Thankfully, the bubble system appears to have held firm in school with pupil cases being restricted to one bubble. WCC Public Health Team are undertaking enhanced testing of results, however it would seem this has been a much more contagious case than any others we have experienced before. We have never had more than one isolated case within a bubble.

As the virus begins to pick up again in our region we are also beginning to experience staffing shortages as teachers and support staff are being required to self-isolate having been in contact with cases outside of school. As a result of this some children may find that they are being taught by different members of staff at times over the next few weeks. We thank you for your understanding during this final phase before the summer.

Set up the device safely



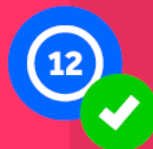
Use the device setting so you can only download age appropriate apps and games



Disable location services so your child doesn't unintentionally share their location with others



Set up password control or disable in-app purchasing so big bills are not run up accidentally



Download age appropriate apps you're happy for your child to use

Talk about staying safe



If your children are 8-10 years old, download our parent / child Internet Matters app to help you talk about e-safety issues in an interactive way.



Be aware of key issues and how to discuss them with your children so they know how to stay safe online



If your child is using social networking apps check their profile and privacy settings, making sure they are not sharing personal or private information with people they do not know
