- ⇒ It starts with one kind word.




HOW TO PACK A SHOEBOX

Select a quality toy such as a doll, football with pump, or cuddly toy to bless a child.






PERSONALISE & PRAY: Including a personal note and photo makes a big impact. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.
