They will certainly join me in wishing her an excellent Christmas break and good luck for the future.




Making






SANTA IS HERE!!

The new Gardening groups have had a very busy and constructive half term; initially they used illustrated spotter sheets provided by the Woodland Trust and RHS to identify habitats and common garden features.

Straight away they realised that we didn't have a greenhouse, and that it would make an excellent addition to the space. Over the past few weeks they have built and installed a donated greenhouse in a sunny spot next to the habitat area.

This week they have enjoyed filling the greenhouse with a variety of unusual winter salad and vegetable plants, from Borecole to Giant Red Mustard. The Red Russian Kale they planted in the raised bed is doing well; the children were intrigued to learn that Kale was the most popular vegetable throughout Europe in the Middle Ages.

Leaves have been gathered to make leaf mould as well, to improve the soil. All the gardeners are looking forward to tasting their produce in the New Year!
