Welcome Back to School

It is great to have our children back in school this week, refreshed and ready to learn after the Easter Holidays.

Summer term this year will have a 'returning to normal' feel as our series of summer trips for all year groups take place along with sports days, end of year celebrations and other transition events.



SATs

In addition to all of the fun events (!) there is a return of SATs in both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. These are the first formal assessments since May 2019 and although results will not be published in league table form this year, they will be used to help assess any gaps in attainment that have developed since 2019 as children transition to the next phase of their education.

Year 6 SATs will take place 9th—12th May each morning, and KS1 SATs assessments will be spread out over the three weeks beginning on 9th May.

Full attendance by Year 6 pupils during the week beginning 9th May is extremely important. Pupils are only able to take part in the assessment on the specific morning of that test. Absent KS2 pupils are not able to retake a test at a later date.

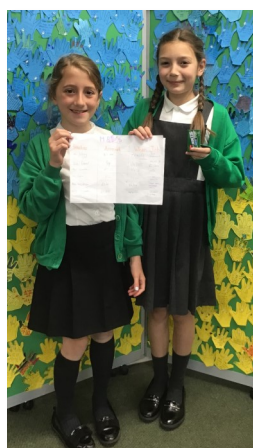

ABOUT THE LITTLE PRINCESS TRUST:

The Little Princess Trust was established in 2006 by the parents of Hannah Tarplee, their friends and Hereford Cathedral Junior School. In 2004 Hannah was diagnosed with a Wilms tumour. Hannah loved her hair and losing it was very traumatic for her. Her parents, Wendy and Simon, searched high and low to find a wig suitable for Hannah, during her treatment. When they found one, it had a hugely positive effect on Hannah.

Tragically, Hannah passed away in 2005 and with so many kind offers of financial and practical help, Wendy and Simon felt the most fitting tribute would be to launch a charity dedicated to providing real hair wigs for children and young people.



Since then, they have provided thousands of real hair wigs to sick children and young people, aged up to 24 years across the UK and Ireland, and are now in the early stages of offering services in other areas of Europe and beyond.

In 2016, thanks to the huge efforts of fantastic fundraisers and corporate supporters, they were able to start funding pioneering academics and institutions leading the way in researching new and better treatments for all paediatric cancers. An area where there is so much work which desperately needs investment. They have committed more than £17million across almost 93 projects covering a range of childhood cancers.

They strive to improve patient outcomes through access to new treatments through clinical trials as well as improving existing treatments. They are working incredibly hard to identify innovative and impactful ways to improve survival and reduce the effects of treatment, with the mission to invest in the right areas to fill some of these funding gaps.

Generous volunteers and fundraisers like Freya work incredibly hard to ensure they can continue to help even more children and young people.

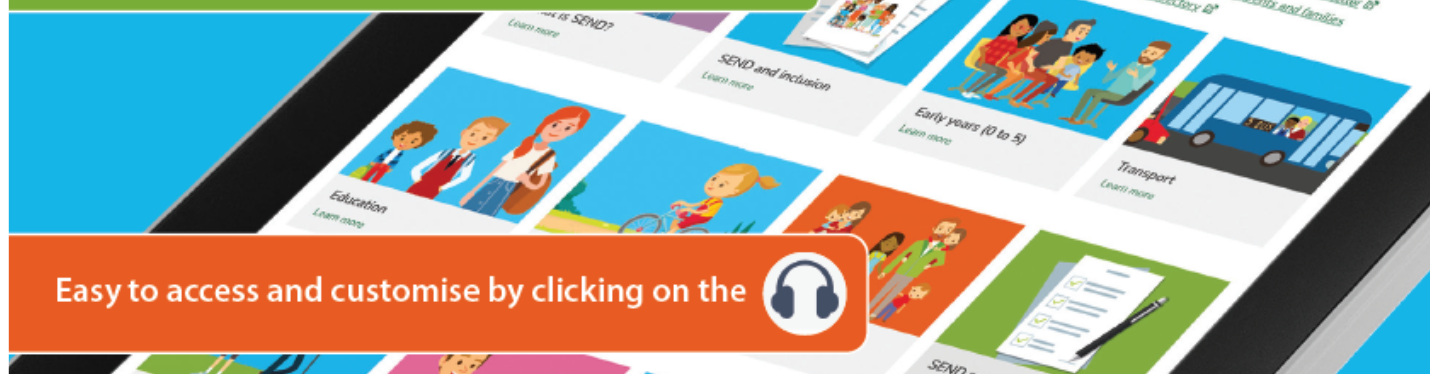
