#### What are you most excited about happening?

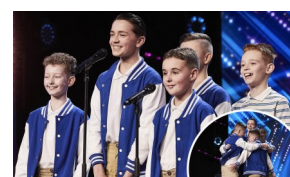
The whole thing has been really exciting, and it's been great getting to hang out a lot before the semi finals.

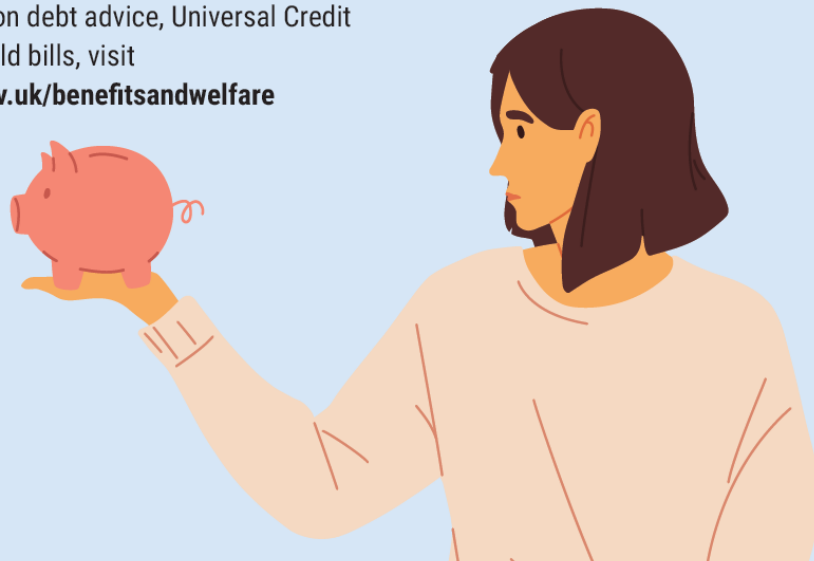

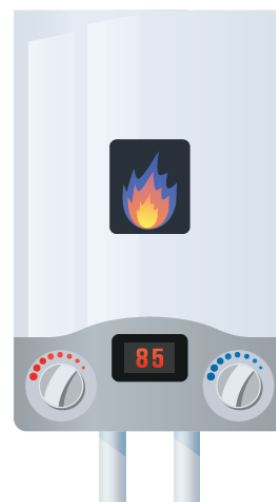
